


Get Fit



The World Masters Games in April this year was an amazing event. It is only held every four years and it is the biggest multi sport event in the world. Bigger than the Olympics, and right on our doorstep in Auckland so I couldn't resist!

Nice racing with her in the TT and I won by only 20 seconds on our not so smooth Cambridge roads. It was another great event though put on by Dynamo Events.

The RR was really cool this year with four of us handcyclists of around the same ability men and women working together for most of the ride and a sprint finish in the last kilometer which I am happy to say I won but it was pretty close between us all.







rotary charity dinner

A delighted Cambridge Rotary president Dennis Finn described the May 19th event as a "fantastic success". With the final tally still to be determined, he said the amount raised through ticket sales, the charity auction, raffles and pledges was likely to approach \$30,000. "That is far higher than we had anticipated. We had a great crowd who participated particularly well. The auction alone raised around \$17,500. It was a fantastic success." The Cambridge Rotary Paralympic Charity Dinner attracted 240 guests to Mighty River Domain's Don Rowland Centre.

Paralympic gold medallist Liam Malone took the podium as guest speaker. The 23-year-old para-athlete represented New Zealand in the 2016 Summer Paralympics in Rio de Janeiro, winning gold in the men's 200 metres and 400 metres, and the silver medal in the men's 100 metre events.

Both Paralympics NZ and Parafed Waikato gave presentations, as did Parafed Waikato's David Klinkhamer. Fiona Allan, Paralympics New Zealand chief executive, said: "We would like to formally thank the Cambridge Rotary Club and their supporters for their generosity." She described the fundraising event as a "wonderful effort" and said monies raised would assist Paralympians such as Liam compete on the world stage.

"It will also support the development of programmes designed to find the Paralympians of tomorrow, and locally enable physically disabled people into disability sports in the Waikato," she added. Her appreciation was echoed by Parafed Waikato co-chair and former Paralympian, Tiffiney Perry, who said that raising funds to support the 100 plus people on their database was an ongoing focus for the organisation, and an event such as had been held by Cambridge Rotary was immensely helpful. "We do something like holding a casino night once a year, but it's a lot of work. This has helped us tremendously." "The Rotary dinner had such a great atmosphere ... there was such a good feeling there. All the proceeds coming to Parafed Waikato will go to supporting local people."

First time players were supported by players including some who have played for New Zealand's unofficial test team in the Ditch Cup in Australia. A particular highlight was the willingness of some players to join opposing teams to make up numbers. This was typical of the tone of the event; regional rivalry underpinned by a sense of community, cooperation and friendliness. A credit to all involved.

Feedback via Facebook and email has been overwhelmingly positive with the organisation and running of the event, the provision of food including a free barbeque and sponsor feedback all indicating a great experience and sets a high benchmark for 2018.





We left NZ on March 13th to head to Cape Town and now - this wonderful tournament is over for another four years. Many friendships were renewed and many new friendships formed by all of us. The venue "Western Province Cricket Club", Newlands, Cape Town was a wonderful venue. Four lovely manicured grass greens running at around 13 seconds so slower to what we have here. We had gone prepared for plenty or practice time though and were invited to visit three other bowling greens around Cape Town which we did.

The Opening Ceremony was held on Sunday afternoon 19th March with all teams marching on to the 'A' green. Very colourful. The NZ Blind Jacks, on more than one occasion was complimented on their uniform. The black and the white always stands out. Backtracking slightly - "Lions International" are the senior sponsors of this great tournament. We were all proud to wear their logo on our shirts along with NZ Blind Sport.
